



It begins with the eight children we are going to find out about introducing themselves and telling us about the meanings of their names. The children come from the U.K., U.S.A, Brazil, Ghana, Russia, Vietnam, Australia and India. The book illustrates a day in their lives. This highlights similarities rather than differences. The book begins with the children waking up, we find out who else is awake, they get washed, have breakfast and go to school. The book covers several cross-curricular topics from early years and primary teaching, such as 'celebrating diversity', 'a sense of belonging', and 'children learning from children'.
